Rules of the Beach at Myrtle Beach State Park

*Pets must be on a leash at all times. Horry County Ordinance states that animals are not allowed on the beach from 10am to 5pm from May 1 through Labor Day. Owners need to pick up after their pets.



*Tents/cabanas are not allowed— it's an Horry County Ordinance.
Only circular umbrellas no greater than 7'6" in diameter and small pop ups for infants and very small children are allowed.

*Stay off the sand dunes and away from the beach grasses at all times. Always use a boardwalk to reach the beach! Sand dunes are critical nesting habitat for loggerhead sea turtles and are the first line of defense



loggerhead sea turtles and are the first line of defense against storms and high tides.

- *Horry County lifeguards are stationed on the north section of the park from mid May to mid September.
- *Umbrellas can not restrict the view of a lifeguard and must be placed landward of the established lifeguard umbrella line. Umbrellas and chairs are available from the lifeguards for a rental fee.



- *Absolutely no fireworks are allowed on the beach or in the park.
- *Horry County Ordinance states that no bikes are allowed on the beach from 10am to 5pm May 1 through Labor Day.



- *For your safety, swim at least 150 yards away from the fishing pier.
- *Surfing and boogie boarding is not allowed within 75 yards of the fishing pier.
- *Help out sea turtles! Please fill in all holes and flatten sand creations when done for the day. These create dangerous obstacles for turtles.
